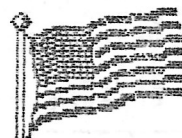
Board Meeting Highlights

MAY: Members of the Board reported favorable reports concerning the maintenance conducted recently. Pool operations for the season were discussed. Mr. Gray proposed that a committee to improve community image and prevent property devaluation be formed. Mr. Gray to report back with recommendations for the committee membership. Five applications for pool operator have been received. Mr. Al Cohen was selected. Jetties at the beach were reported to have been severely damaged by recent storms. The Association's tractor has a serious engine problem. Recommendations from a qualified diesel mechanic will be obtained before a decision to repair or replace is made. The Church ball team has proposed that they upgrade the ball field, donating material and labor. Their proposal was accepted by the Board. An estimate will be obtained for repair of the C-section pier.

JUNE: Board approved a requested variance of setback requirements for lot M145. Approved use of pool in connection with a Church Teen Program "Lock-in". Approved with thanks, a proposal for a tree planting ceremony in connection with the Summer recreation Prog. July 3 Independence Day - Happy Birthday America celebration. Tractor has been repaired at a cost of \$2131. Approved expenditure of \$1000 to stabilize existing park jetties and \$7100 to replace C-sec pier. Agreed to request Civic League, Women's Club and Church for assistance in funding the Summer Recreation Program. The Assoc. will augment funds received to provide a total of \$500 for pay and \$100 for material.

SPECIAL THANKS this month go to Mr. Rubin Styron for his talent in making and giving us the framework for a tow trailer for the small riding mower.

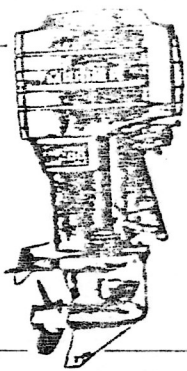
