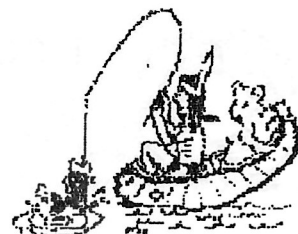

Board Highlights

February - The Snug Harbor Improvement Committee reported on the deliberations of the committee. It was decided to publish an appeal for volunteers to help clean up Snug Harbor (see Feb. News) Wiring for 3 A/C units will be installed. Association income tax returns will be prepared by Mrs. Milliron and Mr. Higgins, saving \$600 which the CPA has charged in prior years. Formation of a Men's Club will be investigated, (see questionnaire in this issue).

March - Receipt of check for \$500 from the Civic League for Clubhouse improvements was reported. Committee was appointed to investigate fee schedule for use of Association facilities. Locks for P-Section restrooms will be rekeyed by Mr. Milliron's (saving Assoc. Locksmith fees). New keys will be issued as assessments are paid. Pay scale of Assoc. employees was adjusted for inflation.

April - An employee sick leave policy was adopted. The Perquimans County of Chamber of Commerce will be invited for a gathering at our park. Contribution was made to the Bethel Vol. Fire Department. New vertical blinds for the clubhouse have been selected. The Assoc. President, T. Herman Dooley tendered his resignation from the Board due to impending relocation to Florida. The Board accepted the resignation with deep regret.

Special April Meeting - Mr. Leo Higgins was elected as acting President to serve until the Board is at full complement of members or for two months, whichever occurs first.

Thanks from the Board of Governors to Mr. Rubin Styron for rehabilitating a trailer for transporting the Association mowing equipment.

Pool Opening

Pool opening day is set for Saturday, May 26 at 1:00 pm and it will be open weekends only until June 13th when School is out. Adult swims are scheduled for 10:00 - Noon Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday, and Wednesday from 7:00 - 8:00 pm.

Each person entering the pool will be required to wear a disc on ankle or wrist. Discs can be obtained at the office by property owners or renters whose 1990 assessments are up to date. Cost is \$1.00, or will be exchanged for 1989 tags. 1990 tags will not be exchanged for 1991 tags. All are asked to please sign in the recording book each time they enter the pool area.

Detailed pool regulations will be provided along with the discs. These rules are designed to ensure that your use of the pool will be a safe and enjoyable experience:

No Food in pool area- except for approved party.

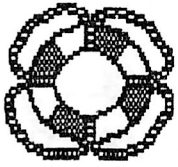
No Inflatable Toys

Parents or friends of children who use the pool are encouraged to get together to organize games, races, swimming lessons, etc. for the pool users. Interested people, please

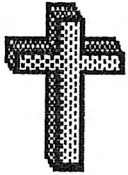

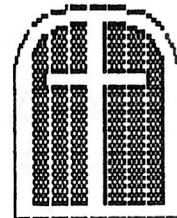

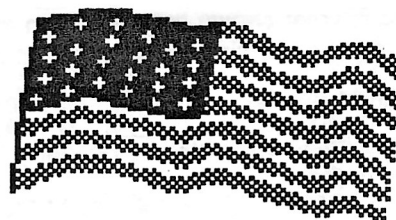

FEATURED PERSONALITIES

T. Herman Dooley, president of the Board of Governors until his recent resignation, and his charming wife Louise are moving from Snug Harbor this month to Bradenton, Florida. They will be missed for they made positive contributions to our community.

Each of them lead full active lives before coming here. She, in her birthplace, Richmond, as a partner in her family's business of seed propagation and distribution, as a school bus driver and especially as a homemaker and mother of two children. Herman made his home in Ohio where he attained degrees in music from Miami University and a masters degree in music education from Ohio State. Following WWII service in the Pacific he began a 31 year career in the Troy, Ohio High School music department where he rose to the position of supervisor and administrator. During his tenure in Troy he directed and conducted a number of critically acclaimed musical productions, such as The Sound of Music, Fiddler on the Roof, Oklahoma and Hello Dolly. In addition he directed several school and church choirs and award winning marching bands

Both Herman and Louise have been lifelong friends of Mil and Bob Armstrong who for many years spent summers in Snug Harbor. Curiously they had never met each other until after each of them were widowed. They met at the Armstrong's annual brunswick stew party in 1982. Not long after they married and in 1985, moved here to Snug Harbor.

The Dooleys perhaps thought, when they moved here, that they would retire to lives of relaxation and rest. Not so. Soon after their arrival Herman accepted a position on the Board of Governors and also agreed to serve as the director of the Snug Harbor Church choir. Louise has supported him throughout. As president of the Board, Herman has worked to foster cooperation between all elements of our community and the music in the Church has improved immeasurably.

The Dooleys brought harmony to Snug Harbor. Soon they will be off to work on thier handicaps on the golf course which their new condo overlooks. Thanks Louise and Herman. Our best wishes go with you.
