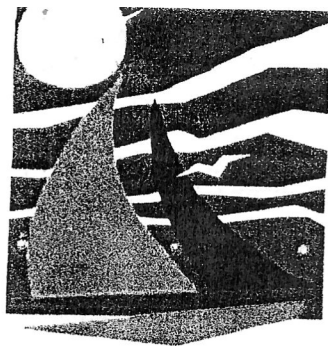
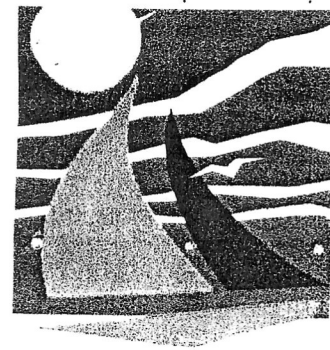

At the same DOT meeting we also provided documentation and pictures addressing the poor drainage system along the state-maintained roads in our community. We asked for guidance as to what else we need to provide to gain their assistance in this matter. We are also concerned that the poor drainage will be breeding beds for mosquitoes. I will provide more on this in the next newsletter. In the mean time, if residents would remove debris and leaves from the ditches in front of their property, the drainage situation would improve.

The board purchased the necessary cleaning equipment to help with the floor maintenance in the Club House. Thanks to the efforts of the Civic League and your Board, 10 new windows were purchased and installed. The building has not looked this good in years. Efforts are underway now to replace the remaining windows and to upgrade the clubhouse with central air.

The board is also working to upgrade the aesthetics and architectural policies.

Thanks to Bill Polk for regenerating interest in our community watch. The meetings are held the 3rd Tuesday of every month. Please come out and support his efforts.

If you do not buy an annual tag prior to using the pool, the cost of your daily tag, or weekly tag, will not be deducted from the cost of the annual tag.**

Ditches and Culverts

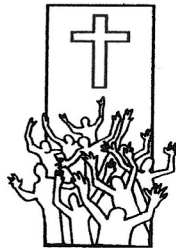
Several Snug Harbor residents have asked about cleaning the ditches in front of their property. In addition, ditches that are overgrown prevent the flow of storm water and provide excellent breeding grounds for mosquitoes and other undesirable insects. As we move into the spring and summer this will become more critical. In cases involving ditches along state owned streets, you can call Mr. Swain at the Perquimans County DOT office to complain. On community owned roads we are making every effort to ensure that they remain cut and clean. We ask that whether it is a state owned road or ours, if the ditch abuts your property, you can help all of Snug Harbor by maintaining those ditches free of debris and keeping them cut to increase water flow.

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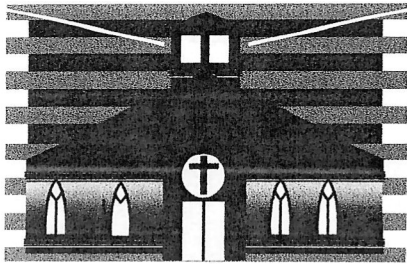
